



Job Description: Bilingual Mental Health Counselor

Job Summary: The Bilingual Mental Health Counselor will provide mental health counseling sessions for Spanish-speaking student clients of The Health Center, as well as communication with Spanish-speaking parents/guardians. This position is based primarily at Blue Ridge Elementary School. Mental health services to students are provided during school hours, when school is in session.

Principle Responsibilities of the Position:

- Provide individual and group mental health counseling for The Health Center clients consistent with standards established by the Washington State Department of Health and The Health Center policy.
- Deliver “best practice” individual and small group counseling services.
- Complete required documentation (intake, visit notes, billing slip, etc.) promptly and efficiently, according to organizational policy
- Participate with The Health Center interdisciplinary team to provide mental health care recommendations for students and/or multi-disciplinary team meetings with outside agencies.
- Consult with primary care provider, teacher, school counselor, and other mental health professionals as needed.
- Make appropriate referrals as needed based on clinical judgment, providing the student at least 2 options for care.
- Provide counseling sessions for parents with students as needed.
- Provide case management, advocacy, and resource linkage.
- Develop and facilitate support groups.
- Maintain professional behavior and relationships with school faculty, Health Center staff and referral resources.
- Attend monthly peer-to-peer and one-on-one supervision with the Mental Health Supervisor.
- Participate in activities that promote professional development and use clinical/educational research to enhance therapy services.
- Support and follow the policies and procedures of The Health Center
- Assist The Health Center in following emergency and crisis procedure guidelines.

Education and Experience Requirements of the Position:

- Minimum Qualification: Graduate of accredited masters program in Social Work and/or Mental Health Counseling
- Understanding of psychodynamics of children, adolescents, and treatment strategies for common mutual health problems of children and adolescents.

Knowledge/Skills/Abilities Requirements:

- Ability to communicate fluently in both English and Spanish
- Effective oral and written communication skills
- Demonstrated ability to facilitate management of patients in clinic setting
- Compliance with Washington State and United States federal laws and regulations for the provision of ambulatory mental health services
- Proper mental health record keeping in compliance with HIPPA
- Ability to be flexible with day-to-day scheduling changes
- Culturally sensitive and willing to work with persons from various socioeconomic and ethnic backgrounds
- Seek and take advantage of opportunities for professional growth

Preferences:

- Familiar with ACEs (Adverse Childhood Experiences) and trauma-informed practices
